

Services That Require Access to a Human Rights Team

Services that require a provider to have access to a Human Rights Team:

- The following participant-directed services through an Agency With Choice Financial Management Services organization:
 - In-Home and Community Support
 - Companion
 - Supported Employment
 - Homemaker/Chore
 - In-Home and Out-of-Home Respite
 - Respite camps serving 25% or more of people with disabilities
 - Supports Broker
- Respite camps serving 25% or more of people with disabilities (both providers that enroll with the Department and those that receive payment through an Organized Health Care Delivery System)
- The following services funded through the Consolidated, Community Living or Person/Family Directed Support waivers or base-funding:
 - Community Participation Support
 - Homemaker/Chore
 - In-Home and Community Support
 - Residential Habilitation
 - In-Home and Out-of-Home Respite
 - Respite camps serving 25% or more of people with disabilities
 - Supported Employment
 - Therapy Services
 - Supports Broker Services
 - Advanced Supported Employment
 - Behavioral Support
